


Financial Update

In the month of March, our operating revenues were \$34,993. Our operating expenses totaled \$43,531. This put us over budget for the month by \$8,538. However, at the end of the first quarter, we are net positive \$4,191 YTD.

Below are graphs showing the first quarter monthly average income and expenses from 2018-2021 as compared to Q1 2022 and compared to what we budgeted per month. While there are several large pledge payments that are paid in full at the beginning of the year (skewing the bar graph), March pledge payments remain strong and above average for what was budgeted. We had some unforeseen expenses in the first quarter with significant heating repairs. Additionally, during the office remodel, asbestos was found requiring an abatement we had not anticipated.
