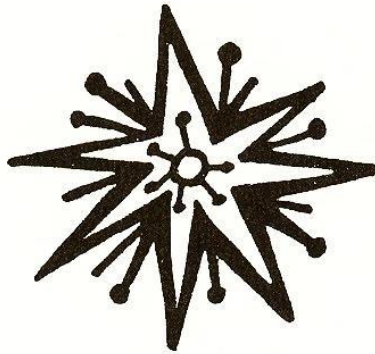

The Nicene Creed

Presider: Let us affirm the faith of the Church:

We believe in one God,
the Father, the Almighty,
maker of heaven and earth,
of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,
the only Son of God,
eternally begotten of the Father,
God from God,
Light from Light,
true God from true God,
begotten, not made,
of one Being with the Father.

Through him all things were made.

For us and for our salvation
he came down from heaven:
by the power of the Holy Spirit
he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary,
and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate;
he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again
in accordance with the Scriptures;
he ascended into heaven
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead,
and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit,
the Lord, the giver of life,
who proceeds from the Father. **

With the Father and the Son
he is worshipped and glorified.

He has spoken through the Prophets.

We believe in one holy, catholic and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

We look for the resurrection of the dead,


We lift them to the Lord.

Father, you never forget us or turn away from us, even when we fail you. You sent your Son Jesus who gave his life for us. He healed those who were sick, cared for those who were poor, and cried with those who were sad. He forgave sinners and taught us to forgive. For all your love we give you thanks in the way that Jesus showed us.

On the night before he died, while he was having supper with his friends, he took bread and offered you thanks. He broke the bread, and gave it to them, saying: "Take, eat. This is my Body: it is broken for you."

After supper, he took the cup, he offered you thanks, and gave it to them saying: "Drink this, all of you. This is my Blood of the new covenant; it is poured out for you, and for all, that sins may be forgiven. Do this in remembrance of me."

So, as we do what he told us,

we open our hearts to him;

we remember how he died

and rose again to live now in us.

Together with him we offer you these gifts:

in them we give you ourselves.

Hear us, most merciful God, and send your Holy Spirit on us and on this bread and this wine, that, overshadowed by your Spirit's life-giving power, they may be the Body and Blood of your Son. Kindle within us the fire of your love and renew us for the service of your Kingdom.

Help us, who are baptised into the fellowship of Christ's Body, to live and work to your praise and glory; may we grow together in unity and love until at last, in your new creation, we enter into our heritage in the company of Stephen and all the apostles, prophets, and of all our siblings living and departed.

Through Jesus Christ our Lord, with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory are yours, now and for ever. **Amen.**

Cover Text: Isaiah 60:1 and The Song of Simeon, Luke 2:29-32 from the Book of Common Prayer, 1979.

Opening Acclamation: Isaiah 60:1

The Collects:

The Collect of the Season from The Book of Common Prayer, 1979. The Collects of the Day, in the inserts, are assigned by the lectionary.

Affirmation of Faith/Creed:

This text of the Nicene Creed omits the phrase ‘and the Son’ in the third paragraph, recovering the original text of the First Councils of Nicaea and Constantinople (325 and 381CE respectively) and once again aligning ourselves with our brothers and sisters in the Orthodox Church. This version was approved for use in worship by The Episcopal Church in 1997, published in *Enriching Our Worship I*.
