
## The Great Vigil of Easter A Collaborative Celebration

#### Thanksgiving over the water

Presider: Praise God who made heaven and earth,

All: Who keeps his promise for ever.

Presider: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. All: It is right to give thanks and praise.

During prayer over the water, when Presider says, "Saving God," All respond: "give us life."

Presider sprinkles the people with water from the font as a reminder that it was through our baptism that we entered in Christ's fellowship, the Church.

#### Presiders concludes with:

We thank you, Almighty God, for our baptism into the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Alleluia, Christ is Risen!

We praise you, all-holy God, today, tomorrow, and forever.


All: Amen.
