

The Nicene Creed

Presider: Let us affirm the faith of the Church:

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God,
eternally begotten of the Father,
God from God, Light from Light,
true God from true God,
begotten, not made,
of one Being with the Father.
Through him all things were made.
For us and for our salvation
he came down from heaven:
by the power of the Holy Spirit
he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary,
and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried.
On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.
He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit,
the Lord, the giver of life,
who proceeds from the Father. **
With the Father and the Son he is worshipped and glorified.
He has spoken through the Prophets.
We believe in one holy, catholic and apostolic Church.
We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.
We look for the resurrection of the dead,
and the life of the world to come.
Amen.

We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of our Savior Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your Name. Amen.

The Absolution

Presider: Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins

through the grace of Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. **Amen**.

Presider: The Peace of Christ be always with you,

People: and also with you.

Presider: Lift up your hearts.


People: We lift them to the Lord.

Then the Celebrant continues

We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in Jesus Christ, the Word made flesh. For in these last days you sent Jesus to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In Christ, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In Christ, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Savior Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper Jesus took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore, according to his command, O Father, We remember Christ's death, We proclaim Christ's resurrection, We await Christ's coming in glory;

And we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, O Savior of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.

We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Sacrament of the Body of Christ and his Blood

of the new Covenant. Unite us in the sacrifice of Jesus Christ, through whom we are acceptable to you, being sanctified by the Holy Spirit.

In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with Stephen and all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your children; through Jesus Christ our Savior, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation.

By Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty God, now and for ever. **AMEN**.


The Lord's Prayer

Cover Text

Opening Acclamation

Lighting of the Advent Candle(s)

Drawn from the text of Luke 1:78,79

The Collects

The Collect of the Season is drawn from *Daily Prayers for All Seasons*. The Collects of the Day, found in the inserts, are assigned in the lectionary.

The Affirmation of Faith/Creed

This text of the Nicene Creed omits the phrase 'and the Son' in the third paragraph, recovering the original text of the First Councils of Nicaea and Constantinople (325 and 381CE respectively) and once

again aligning ourselves with our brothers and sisters in the Orthodox Church. This version was approved for use in worship by The Episcopal Church in 1997, and published in *Enriching Our Worship I*.

Prayers of the People

Inspired by a form in *Daily Prayers for All Seasons*, and then heavily adapted to be appropriately functional for congregational use on a Sunday.

Concluding Collects for the Prayers of the People:

Form I is from the *Book of Common Prayer*, 1979, p. 395. Form II is from the *Order of St. Helena's Breviary*.

This is Prayer B, Expansive Language version, adapted from *The Book of Common Prayer*, 1979. (Approved at General Convention 79 in 2018, for trial usage.)

Post Communion Prayer

Form I, from the BCP 1979, Expansive Language version. Form II is adapted from Common Worship, Services and Prayers for The Church of England, Additional Eucharistic Prayers.

The Blessings

Blessing I is paraphrased from I Thessalonians 5, and commonly used across the Anglican Communion; with the Trinitarian blessing as phrased by the Order of St. Helena.

Blessing II is one-part Celtic blessing, one-part from my friend The Rev. Ben Nelson (his father actually, also The Rev. Nelson) and one third Trinitarian blessing as phrased by the *Order of St. Helena*. *Put together, creating my favorite blessing!*
